MEMBERSHIP

In order to participate in TYPA classes, one must first be a member of TYPA. TYPA welcomes everyone from the international community and has members from all around the world. Joining TYPA is a simple process. Just submit the completed Master Registration Form (can be downloaded from our website) along with a copy of the new member's foreign passport to req@typa.org.tw. Due to Taiwan government regulations that govern the charter of TYPA, all members must be foreign nationals holding a foreign passport. The registration fee is \$1,600 per semester and \$800 for summer activities. The fall 2022 semester is from August to December and the spring 2023 semester is from January to May.

REGISTRATION

TYPA has three main registration periods; registration for fall programs takes place in late April / early May; registration for spring programs in November / early December; and summer activity registration in March. Please remember that the full payment must accompany registration.

Re-Registration

During the April / May fall registration, continuing students in progressive skill programs from the spring semester will receive priority (Advanced Registration Notice) to re-register for those classes.

During the November / December spring registration, continuing students in all programs from the fall semester will receive priority to re-register for their classes and spaces are guaranteed. Forms of payment can be arranged through "MY TYPA" online.

Open Registration

Open registration is for current members who wish to register for additional activities and new members who are enrolling for the first time at TYPA.

E-MAIL & COMMUNICATIONS

TYPA sends out weekly email news announcing events, class changes, sports schedules and upcoming registration dates. If you wish to be on our mailing list, please simply click the "Join Mailing List" button on the bottom of our website. TYPA will not sell or give your email address to other members or third parties. Mail is sent using Constant Contact® with the recipient list hidden.

CREDIT CARD PRE-AUTHORIZATION

WAITING LIST

Members may be put on the waiting list when a class is fully booked. When a currently enrolled member withdraws and their space becomes available, you will be informed immediately. According to the withdrawal policy, this usually happens during the first two weeks of the semester. The waiting list will be voided when the semester ends.

TAS KINDERGARTEN PICK UP SERVICE

TYPA can pick up TAS kindergarten students and bring them to their 2:45 group class. We can also bring them to their bus or to the <u>TAS Car Pickup Area</u> after class. If this is an option you are interested in, please inform the TYPA office.

FACILITIES USAGE

All participants are reminded that we use TAS facilities for our programs. There will be times in the year when classes may be cancelled or temporarily moved to other locations on campus. It should be noted that TAS curricular programs take priority over TYPA recreational activities. Members are asked to please take this into consideration when signing up for TYPA activities.

■ CREDIT & REFUND POLICY

Withdrawal will only take effect after the member has presented TYPA with the appropriate withdrawal form which can be downloaded from our website.

REGISTRATION FEE

The TYPA registration fee is non-refundable.

If withdrawal is completed before the due dates listed below, a \$500 processing fee will be deducted from the remaining program cost and the remainder will be refunded or credited. For

summer programs, please refer to page 76.

Credits are transferable to any other class or program for a period of one year from the time of the withdrawal. The transferred credits can also be used by any member of the same family.

Refunds will be issued by check within three weeks of withdrawal notice. For amounts of less than \$3,000 a cash refund can be requested. All payments made by credit card can only be refunded to the card itself.

If the member relocates, a refund will only be issued if the withdrawal is before October 15, 2022 for the fall semester or before April 1, 2023 for the spring semester. For Tiger Tots policy, please refer to page 61.

CLASS CHANGES

Due to the possibility of unforeseen circumstances, such as room availability or teacher illness, TYPA reserves the right to add, cancel or change classes.

In case of a typhoon alert, check our website, or call TYPA to verify if your class has been cancelled or not.

If TYPA cancels a class, credit will be given. If a student simply misses a class, there will be no make up or refund. Students may only attend the class on the day / time they are registered.



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FORCE MAJEURE

Please be aware that TYPA may be ordered to temporarily or permanently close or alter its operations, or may decide to, as a result of a force majeure event.

Force majeure, is any event beyond the reasonable control of TYPA including but not limited to natural disaster, accident, war, civil unrest, outbreak of disease, and compliance with law or government order.

TYPA shall make reasonable efforts to provide recreational / educational services and activities during the force majeure event, but TYPA has no liability arising therefrom. TYPA will have no obligation to pay tuition, fees or issue credits in the event of any Force Majeure event.

LONG-TERM ILLNESS OR INJURY

Participants will only be entitled to a credit or refund for long term illness or injury if they withdraw from the activity or class for the rest of the semester. This will be on a prorated basis, a \$500 processing fee will be deducted from the remaining program cost and the TYPA Registrar

must be informed immediately of the illness or injury.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

TYPA carries liability insurance for all participants on the TAS and Tiger Tots Place campuses where TYPA activities are held, but does not carry personal medical and accident insurance, which is deemed to be a personal family responsibility. Reasonably priced, on-island (Taiwan) accident insurance is available through the TYPA insurance company for TYPA members. Information about the insurance is available at the TYPA office.

FINANCIAL AID

TYPA will never turn a child away from participating in its programs due to an inability to pay for a program or a membership. Partial sponsorships are available based on individual need. Sponsorships are made possible by contributions from corporations and individual donors.

SPORTS



GENERAL INFORMATION

The TYPA sports calendar is divided into three seasons. The basketball season starts with the new school year and generally finishes close to Halloween. Soccer follows basketball and straddles the first and second semesters. Baseball is the final team sport and is completed during the last weeks of the school year. Both basketball and soccer are registered as fall semester programs, while baseball is registered as a spring semester program. Children of all abilities are welcome to join in the excitement of our sports programs. Each player will receive a team T-shirt, team photo, team souvenir and participate in an end-of-season awards ceremony.

As our goal is to develop each player's skills and knowledge of the game, we strive for teams to be as evenly matched as possible. For athletes in 2nd through 5th grades, there is a mandatory skill assessment done by our sports staff. Players will be placed on a team once the assessment has been completed. Please be aware of the registration cutoff dates as we cannot give refunds or credits after this date.

When sports practices are cancelled due to bad weather or other unforseen circumstances, refunds, credits or make ups will not be given. Games may be cancelled due to severe weather or poor air quality.

I TENNIS

Tennis students will need to purchase their own tennis rackets to be used for tennis lessons. Tennis or sports shoes must be worn to avoid injuries and students will also need to wear proper sportswear in class.

Tennis Lessons Grades: 1-12

Come join TYPA tennis and learn how to serve, volley and hit a ground stroke! It's a great opportunity for you to learn various tennis techniques with our outstanding tennis coaches. The TYPA tennis program is comprised of **FOUR DIFFERENT TENNIS LESSONS OPTIONS:**

1. TENNIS CLINIC - Three coaches collectively instruct 15-20 students of all levels. Tennis clinic lessons are only offered from 2:45-3:35pm (Mon-Fri). We also offer a special tennis clinic lesson on Friday 3:45-4:40pm for grade 5 and older students. At the beginning of each semester, students will be assigned into different groups based on their assessed level and age. Tennis students will not be able to choose their own instructor.

To be fair, each student may only enroll in two tennis clinic classes per week.

- 2. PRIVATE One on one
- 3. SEMI-PRIVATE One coach with 2 students
- 4. GROUP One coach with 4 students

All Private, Semi-private and Group lessons are scheduled between 3:45-6:45pm on weekdays, and on Saturdays from 8:00am - 5:30pm.

All tennis lessons are scheduled in the following manner:

Towards the end of each semester, re-registration for continuing students takes place.

During open registration, any available spaces remaining are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. If a desired coach or time is unavailable, names are placed on a waiting list. All waiting lists and special requests are purged at the end of each semester.

Cancellation Policy

After the second week of the semester, no credits or refunds will be given due to withdrawals and no schedule changes will be allowed. There will be no credits or refunds for missed tennis clinics, group lessons or semi-private lessons. Private lessons are allowed one cancellation per semester, but the cancellation must be done at least 24 hours in advance. Please note, cancelled tennis lessons will not be made up.

Regarding injury cancellation, we will only issue a refund to an injured student if they withdraw for the rest of the semester. This will be on a prorated basis. A \$500 processing fee will be deducted from the remaining program cost and the TYPA Registrar must be informed as soon as possible of the injury. Please provide a medical certificate when applying for an injury refund. Once the injury application has been submitted, the student will lose priority registration for the re-registration period.

Announcements on the cancellations of tennis lessons due to inclement weather will be made at 2:00 pm on the day of the lesson. Cancellation text messages will be sent to parents once the cancellation is confirmed. If the cancellation is made after 3:45pm, tennis coaches will contact the parents individually. Parents can call the TYPA office to inquire about cancellations after 2:00pm. Lessons cancelled by TYPA will be credited or refunded at the end of the semester.

Tennis Courts Usage

Please note that TYPA tennis lessons will be held on the TAS Rubber D Area.

Sometimes we will be allowed to use the TAS indoor or rooftop tennis facilities for lessons but please understand that it is not guaranteed for every semester. When the indoor or rooftop courts are unavailable, we will move back to offer lessons on the TAS Rubber D Area. We will not issue any credits or refund or makeup lessons when there are facility changes.

There will be times during the year when tennis lessons may be cancelled due to conflicts with TAS activities. Members should note that TAS's curricular programs take priority over TYPA recreational activities. Please take this into consideration when signing up for TYPA tennis programs.

Tennis Waiting List

When TYPA tennis lessons are full, members can fill out a tennis waiting list form and submit it to the TYPA office. If any spot becomes available, the next member on the waiting list will be contacted. According to the withdrawal policy, this usually happens during the first two weeks of the semester. The waiting lists expire at the end of the semester.

Partnering up

If you sign up for a semi-private lesson, please endeavor to find a partner for yourself beforehand. If you cannot find a partner, please sign up for a private lesson initially and TYPA will try to help you find a partner at your level and age.

If you sign up for a semi-private or group lesson, but your partner(s) decide to cancel or reschedule to another time slot, your tuition will be adjusted according to the number of students registered for that class.



DANCE

GENERAL INFORMATION

First semester dance classes concentrate on fundamentals, techniques, flexibility, and body placement. Second semester dance classes concentrate on performing skills. Students will also learn a choreographed routine to be performed in the Spring Dance Recital in May. For maximum benefit, we recommend students begin their dance studies in the fall and continue into the spring.

All of the dance classes (except Baby Ballet) will perform on stage at the Spring Dance Show. Please be aware that there will be additional costs for costumes

DRESS CODE POLICY

The TYPA Dance Department has a dress code for all dance classes. It is the student's responsibility to acquire the appropriate attire necessary for individual classes.

TYPA does not sell or otherwise provide uniforms. Students are required to purchase their own uniforms from a local retailer or with assistance from the dance instructor. Families, please contact your dance instructor for further assistance if needed.



| CHEERLEADING DANCE

Dancers need to wear lightweight clothing that allows for easy movement. Jazz or sports shoes should be worn for traction.





Whether you wish to train competitively or recreationally, your body will benefit from the exercise and discipline required.

As safety is top priority, our TYPA gymnastics coaches will ensure all gymnasts are placed in the appropriate level and it normally takes two semesters to advance to the next level.

Due to equipment and space limitation, only female gymnasts will be able to join our advanced and/or elite classes.

GYMNASTICS MEETS

TYPA will attempt to schedule gymnastics meets for Advanced/Elite gymnasts with other local and international gymnastics organizations. Only Advanced/Elite gymnasts who signed up for 4+ hours of classes per week starting from the beginning of the semester will be invited to participate in gymnastics meets (overseas and local).

The gymnastics meet is not guaranteed or part of the activity fee. Please understand that there will be no cancellations of class if there are no gymnastics meet for the current semester. Any extra meets or travel will be at the expense of the participants.

DRESS CODE POLICY

All gymnastics classes require loose or stretchy workout clothing. Avoid wearing jeans or skirts and take off watches, jewelry, and protruding hair gear. All classes will be conducted bare foot in the covered gymnastics room. Advanced and Elite gymnasts should wear leotards for class



Our music instructors are exceptionally talented with a wealth of experience, and most possess Master of Music degrees specializing in music performance with many still performing in recitals and concerts throughout the year.

Students should either own or rent their own instrument for weekly practice. While TYPA doesn't sell or rent instruments, we can assist you in finding one either to buy or for rent. A music recital will be held at the end of the school year and each student has the option to participate.

MUSIC AGREEMENT

Music lessons can begin at any time during the semester depending on availability and lessons will be prorated from the actual starting date.

Every parent or adult student is required to read and understand the TYPA Music Agreement. The Music Agreement is available at the TYPA office, on our website, or in the TYPA Music Notebook.

Please do not enroll in the TYPA music program unless you are able to make a weekly commitment to your music lessons. In the event you are not able to make a class, a friend or family member will not be allowed to take that class for you unless they are already a student of the same TYPA music teacher.

Each student is only allowed one make up lesson per semester (except Camp Taiwan).

Please note that there may be additional costs for music books.

RECITALS

There will be an annual music recital held at the end of the Spring semester. It will take place in April and/or May on the Taipei American School campus. The music recital is an excellent opportunity for students to boost their confidence and show off their skills in front of an audience!

CANCELLATION & MAKEUP LESSON

After the second class of the semester, no credits or refunds will be given due to withdrawals. There will be no credit or makeup for missed group and semi-private lessons. Private lessons are allowed one cancellation per semester, but the cancellation must be done at least 24 hours prior to your lesson time.

I PRIVATE LESSONS

Piano Grades: K-Adult

Flute Grades: 2-Adult

GENERAL INFORMATION

TYPA offers martial arts classes in four distinct disciplines – Aikido, Karate, Ninja, and Taekwon-Do. Martial arts teaches respect, courtesy, self-discipline, and improves flexibility, strength, stamina, health, and fitness.

Discipline, attitude, and respect for martial arts will be emphasized in each class. Examples of the above guidelines include promptness to class, proper wearing of uniforms, and respect for the martial arts master and fellow students.

All TYPA martial arts classes are minimal body contact with occasional sparring practice for students at a more advanced level.

Belt Advancement Tests

Each martial arts discipline has a colored belt (ranking) system allowing students to set their goals and challenge themselves. Testing criteria will not only include skills, but also discipline, attitude, and respect displayed throughout the semester. Students will not

advance to the next belt level unless all these criteria are met to the satisfaction of the instructor. It is not mandatory to take the test, however, it is recommended if your child would like to advance to the next level.

Students will be required to purchase a uniform at the beginning of the semester and students will have the opportunity to take a test at the end of the semester. Please note there will be an additional cost for tests.

Dress Code Policy for Martial Arts

Students will be required to wear a specific uniform for each discipline. They are required to purchase their own uniforms with assistance from the instructor. Students must be in a properly fitted uniform by the third lesson or they will not be able to participate in class. Each discipline has its own unique uniform and a different belt system.

I AIKIDO

Aikido in its present form was developed in Japan in the early 20th century. Aikido is seen not only as a system of self-defense, but also as a means of self-cultivation and improvement. It is unique among martial arts in that the majority of techniques are based on aggressors making the first move and using their energy and momentum to neutralize them.

Aikido Grades: 1-Adult

On a physical level, Aikido involves some throws and joint locks. It focuses not on punching or kicking, but rather on using the opponent's energy to gain control and throw him away from you.



ABOUT THE TIGER TOTS PROGRAM

At Tiger Tots, we provide a safe, nurturing learning environment for children from the ages of 18 months to 6 years. Our programs have been designed to follow North American standards, and we provide age-appropriate educational goals, values, and philosophies that are implemented within a challenging and exciting learning environment. Play sets the stage for learning and provides the medium through which the children may imitate, explore, test ideas, acquire information, and draw conclusions. Our experienced, caring personnel emphasize and foster a positive self-image while encouraging uniqueness within socialization. The unique interests of each child are used as a guide for inquiries and exploration within the classroom. Tiger Tots also offers weekly gymnastics, music, and Kidsportz classes (4s and 5s), provided by

TYPA specialized instructors. In addition, Mandarin classes are available for those students who want to acquire a new language or improve their first language.

COMMUNITY OF LEARNERS

All of our teachers are qualified educators, many of whom have been with Tiger Tots for several years. They work as a team to develop and implement meaningful and engaging programs for children, based on emergent curriculum planning techniques. Our teachers and teaching assistants are dedicated to participation in ongoing professional development and are also committed to, and encourage, active parent involvement and communication. Together, our love for children and the quality of education we offer creates a wonderful community of learners.

REGISTRATION

Prospective families should fill out a waiting list application and survey forms, which can be downloaded from the TYPA website or picked up at the front desk at either campus. There is no fee for waiting list placement. Upon completion of the forms, new families may be contacted for a required visitation before registration.

A non-refundable registration fee of \$15,000 per semester is required for each child upon his/her acceptance into the program.

Tuition for Fall semester must be paid in full by June 30. Tuition for Spring semester must be paid in full upon registration in November. No refunds or credits will be given (toward TYPA or Tiger Tots programs) after tuition due dates, unless families are leaving Taiwan. If tuition is not paid by the due date, it will be assumed the child will not attend. If parents choose to take a vacation during scheduled school days, tuition will not be refunded or credited for the child's time away from preschool.

All Tiger Tots class fees cover one full semester. Classes are available once a minimum number of participants has been reached.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

A minimum of two weeks written notice is required for withdrawal from all Tiger Tots programs. Please inquire at the TYPA office for a withdrawal form or download one from the TYPA website. Families who must leave Tiger Tots because of relocation to another country may receive a tuition refund for the amount of the semester not used. If the family relocates, a refund will only be issued if the withdrawal is before **October 15**, **2022** for the fall semester or before **April 1**, **2023** for the spring semester. The registration fee is non-refundable.

FORCE MAJEURE

Please be aware that TYPA / Tiger Tots may be ordered to temporarily or permanently close or alter its operations, or may decide to, as a result of a Force Majeure event.

Force Majeure, is any event beyond the reasonable control of TYPA / Tiger Tots including but not limited to natural disaster, accident, war, civil unrest, outbreak of disease, and compliance with law or government order.

TYPA / Tiger Tots shall make reasonable efforts to provide recreational / educational services and activities during the Force Majeure event, but TYPA / Tiger Tots has no liability arising therefrom. TYPA / Tiger Tots will have no obligation to pay tuition, fees or issue credits in the event of any Force Majeure event.

LUNCH

A hot lunch is available for full-day children. Tiger Tots Place provides fresh fruit and orders lunches from local vendors who have demonstrated hygienic food preparation and provide healthy lunch choices. We order lunches from Taipei American School food services for PreK and K children. Lunch orders are placed in advance per semester. Parents can choose to send in a home lunch or a mixture of both choices for their child as well.

DROP OFF & PICK UP

At both campuses, children may be dropped off between 8:30 am and 9:00 am. If you are driving, please be sure to allow our staff to safely transport your child from the car into school. We respectfully ask that children arrive at school on time and are picked up promptly at the end of class time.

For children who are three before Sept. 1, 2022

The Three-Year-Old Program is designed to encourage a balance of child-initiated and teacher-facilitated activities. This program offers children a variety of choices provided within a carefully prepared indoor and outdoor environment. 



Summer Tech Camp Grades: 1-7 (in Fall 2022)

JUN. 6 - JUL. 15

In this camp, students will discover a world of coding, invention and robotics that goes beyond the usual battles, destruction and droids. This program is about using design and engineering skills to invent and build projects that solve problems, look great or make parents go 'Wow!' when they see what their kid has made. This year we are building the camp around three central themes, with a different theme taking place each week. The three themes are Weather and Climate, Transportation and Navigation, and Health and Wearable Technology.

Weather and Climate will enable students to explore sensors and hardware that affect changes in the environment around us. We will use a microcontroller and open-source electronics to build systems that alter conditions for organisms to live in, whether this may be a house or greenhouse.

Transportation and Navigation will introduce students to autonomous driving devices and other cutting edge robotic tools. We will discover how we will build cities of the future

with connected roads and environments. In this course we also introduce students to computer vision, looking at how we use Al to enable cameras to detect specific actions.

Health and Wearables will explore how smart devices like the Apple Watch and Fitbit measure your step count and heart rate. We will explore how this technology can be used to improve our habits to improve our health. We will use different sensors, such as accelerometers, thermometers and pulse sensors to detect data about ourselves and understand how to display it to keep ourselves healthy and also safe during pandemics!
